The thing is, the plant operators were aware of the hazard. They knew it was a hazard and that they had a problem for over 40 years, and yet it was never properly dealt with. This talk examines the reasons why and asks what can be done to avoid letting similar situations arrive in our own organisations.

How to get there

Behind The Wall

By train

The venue is just over 100m from Falkirk Grahamston station which has direct trains from Glasgow, Edinburgh, and Stirling.

Walk up the train station ramp to Grahams Road. Turn Right onto Grahams Road and walk up the hill, continuing under the pedestrian underpass. Turn Right onto Melville Street. The venue will be on your Left.

The route is marked in red on the map above.

By car

The venue is opposite the Melville Street pay and Display car park (note that parking is free after 3pm).

From your car walk uphill towards Melville Street. The venue is visible from the car park.
