Technical Visit to Ferrybridge Multifuel Energy Ltd, Tuesday 22nd October 2019

Date and Venue

Tuesday 22nd October 2019, starting at 1.30 p.m. arrival for 2.00 p.m. start of visit. **Ferrybridge Multifuel1 Project:** Stranglands Lane, Knottingley (directions to be supplied)

The IChemE Clean Energy Special Interest Group, will be undertaking a visit to the Ferrybridge MultFuel (FM1) Project on the afternoon of the 22nd October 2019 There are places for 30 people for the visit, the visit is open to all and registration is on a first come basis.

In 2011, Multifuel Energy Limited (MEL), a 50:50 joint venture between SSE and Wheelabrator Inc, now known as Ferrybridge Multifuel 1 (FM1) began construction in October 2012 and became commercially operational in July 2015. A second plant FM2 is currently being commissioned, but the visit is focused on FM1, which produces low carbon electricity and heat by burning refuse derived fuel (RDF) from various sources of processed solid wastes from municipal, commercial and industrial sources. 900 Tonnes/day of RDF per boiler processed per day (total 3,600T/day for all 4 boilers) produce 3.4GWh/day of green energy, eq. to 140,000 homes.
