Member News

Chemistry at Work (22-23 October 2019)

The basic aim of the event is to promote the chemistry-based professions as a possible career choice to KS4&5 students. The event consists of practising chemists, chemical engineers and pharmacists giving talks about their jobs and careers. These specialists come from a range of backgrounds including industry, consultancy and the universities.

The event, supported by the RSC and IChemE, was attended by over 400 secondary school students from all over Essex and E London - and heard lively careers-focused talks from 25 speakers.

City of London Freeman's School (26 November 2019)





This was part of a well-attended careers fair organised for central-London schools and hosted by the Freeman's School, on the northern approach to the Millennium Bridge.

Technical Events

Hydrogen (07 March 2019)

Our first IMechE / IET co-produced technical event of 2019 was fully-booked. Four speakers covered the field - discussing novel production methods, hydrogen-powered trains, the introduction of hydrogen into the UK natural gas distribution network and developments in "conventional" steam methane reforming and auto-thermal reforming.



Industry 4.0: Artificial Intelligence in Chemical Engineering (4 November 2019)

In November 2019 we held a well-attended technical event at the Shell Centre, on the topic of Industry 4.0: Artificial Intelligence in Chemical Engineering, led by Andrea Iliopoulou (Risk Management—Shell Trading & Supply), co-organised with



Nigel Hobson, VP Trading & Supply Operations at Shell and an IChemE Fellow.

Our speakers were Freddie Darbyshire, Digital Product Manager Downstream & New Energies from Shell's Digital Centre of Excellence and Sak Nayagam, Global Marketing Director, Digital at Baker Hughes. Presentations and discussions revolved around digitalization across the Oil & Gas sector and low carbon solutions that could help companies navigate through the energy transition.

Technical Events

Particulate Pharmaceutical Products (21 November 2019)

On the 21st November 2019 the London & South East IChemE members group and the IChemE Particle Technology Special Interest Group organised a workshop on Manufacturing of Particulate Pharmaceutical Products: Current Trends led by Dr Pablo Garcia-Trinanes (University of Greenwich).




The purpose was to develop professional body capability and to increase collaboration between industry and academia in the field of pharmaceutical manufacturing, education and training. Attended by over 40 representatives, the event aimed to support controlled and targeted delivery, modelling and continuous manufacturing and digital design. Likewise in the audience several members of the IChemE Pharma SIG supported the event.

Dr Marijana Dragosavac, Senior Lecturer for Chemical Engineering department at Loughborough University and Chief Scientific Officer for Micropore Technology Ltd, talked about industrially meaningful production of uniform spherical particles for controlled and targeted delivery using membrane emulsification. Dr Alexander Krok, Marie Curie Fellow at Cork Institute of Technology and Pfizer Newbridge, presented novel and robust prediction models in Pharmaceutical Engineering. And last but not least Dr Marta Moreno Benito, Process Modelling Scientist for Pfizer Worldwide Research and Development, spoke about Digital Twin of Continuous Direct Compression Line for Solid Drug Manufacturing.

The event attracted a numerous and diverse group of representatives in the audience and offered an excellent opportunity for networking. Special thanks to Dr Domenico Macri for facilitating the venue at UCL and his strenuous efforts to make this event a success.

Today's Waste - Tomorrow's Resources (03 December 2019)



This was another in our series of co-produced events involving the IMechE and IET.

With booking numbers into three figures, the audience on the night overcame the impact of an industrial dispute involving train services out of Waterloo, and a very heavy police presence due to a demonstration being expected around Whitehall.

Professor Jonathan Seville and Marvine Besong provided an overview of Recycling Technology's thermal cracking process for treating plastic waste. Dr Massimiliano Materazzi and Dr Ruby Ray updated us on gasification processes for treating municipal waste, with a focus on fluidised bed and plasma technologies.

Industry Insights (23 October 2019)

This year's guest speaker was Kevin Gormley (CEng FIChemE MEI SMAIChE), Chief Risk Engineer for QBE International Markets, speaking on the subject of accidents in the process industries, lessons learned, and their consequences in the current policies.

The technical talk was followed by an Industry Insights discussion panel with the presence of Kevin Gormley from QBE, Sophie Duffield and Laura Miles from GSK, Carl Cota and Colin Tamsett from Johnson Matthey, and Maria Papathanasiou from Imperial College London. The event concluded with a reception and networking session among the 40 attendees from industry and academia.

University News
