University Process Safety Workshops – 23 February and 1 March 2024

On Friday 23 February 2024, the S&LP SIG ran a Process Safety Workshop for the second time at:

Lancaster University

And on Friday 1 March 2024, the S&LP SIG ran Process Safety Workshops at:

- Brunel University London
- Queen Mary University of London (QMUL)
- London South Bank University

as a combined London event and for the second time at:

The American University of Sharjah (AUS, UAE).

221 students attended from across the five institutions and 30 volunteers organised, presented and facilitated the workshops.

QMUL hosted the three London institutions and streamed the morning session to AUS.

Across the five institutions, multiple PhD students, Post Doctorate staff and technical support staff made this possible.

Flixborough 50 Years On

2024 marks 50 years since the incident on 1 June 1974 at Nypro UK Flixborough that changed the UK regulatory framework and onshore industry approach to process safety and major hazards. 28 people on site died, including all in the Control Room and 89 people on and offsite were recorded as injured. A reactor 20" bypass line assembly, installed as a temporary plant change, catastrophically failed after two months of operation during its second start-up and released approx. 30 tonnes of cyclohexane at a pressure of at least 8.6 barg and 155°C. The cyclohexane formed a flammable cloud that ignited and resulted in an Unconfined Vapour Cloud Explosion (UVCE) and multiple fires.

There will be an LPB special issue and other IChemE activities to commemorate the people harmed and lessons that have been and can be learned.

<u>The Flixborough report</u> of the court of enquiry is available on the S&LP SIG website and remains valuable and relevant.

IChemE Process Safety Symposium Papers

- The <u>1982 symposium</u> is titled: 'The Assessment of Major Hazards'.
- The <u>1987 symposium</u> is titled: 'Hazards from Pressure: Exothermic Reactions, Unstable Substances, Pressure Relief and Accidental Discharge'.
- The <u>1990 symposium</u> is titled: 'Piper Alpha Lessons for Lifecycle Safety Management' and took place prior to the publication of Lord Cullen's report.
- The <u>1992 symposium</u> is titled: 'Major Hazards Onshore and Offshore' and explores learnings from Piper Alpha and between onshore and offshore approaches, tools and techniques.
- The <u>1995 symposium</u> is titled: 'Major Hazards Onshore and Offshore II' and explores learnings from Piper Alpha and between onshore and offshore approaches, tools and techniques.

There are papers relevant to a wide range of subjects in this archive including LNG and use of CO_2 pipelines for CCUS.

Plus, a reminder that the S&LP SIG website includes <u>historic Hazards papers</u> (up to and including Hazards 30) with all Crown Copyright papers available up to and including Hazards 33.
