Volunteer Role Descriptor

1. Introduction

IChemE's global network of member community groups are central to delivering its vision of engineering a sustainable world. Their activities are devised and delivered by members.

This is a rare opportunity to get involved in the formation of a SIG – R&I SIG will be IChemE's first special interest group community for members involved in research and innovation. We are looking for enthusiastic individuals who are interested in sharing information and good practice about research, innovation and entrepreneurship, relevant to members around the world active in academic or industrial research, or whose role relies heavily on research and technology development.

It is envisaged that all committee members will contribute to outputs delivering support to members. These may include webinars and other events, newsletters and publications, training, mentoring or other career support, and networking.

2. What you will be doing

Volunteers who occupy committee roles typically:

- endeavour to attend all meetings, or send apologies for absence
- provide comments on papers where you are unable to attend
- prepare for the meeting by reading the agenda, papers, and any emails before the meeting
- share ideas and views
- demonstrate skills, knowledge and interests that relate to specific MG or SIG volunteer roles (e.g., STEM liaison, University liaison, PEI engagement, events organiser etc.)
- take ownership and accountability for the fulfilment of assigned tasks
- participate in the planning and delivery of an annual programme of activities supporting IChemE's strategy.

3. About you

For this role, you are required to be an IChemE member and demonstrate skills, knowledge and interests that relate to the specific SIG and volunteer role.

4. How you will benefit

There are many benefits to volunteering, including:

- personal satisfaction that your contribution helps to support a global network of chemical engineers
- extensive networking opportunities
- volunteering contributes to your continuing professional development (CPD)
- enhances your knowledge of chemical engineering and the opportunities it may offer.

5. Time commitment

Committee members time commitment will vary, however, they may spend 2-4 hours per month on IChemE business.

6. Period of appointment

Special Interest Group committee volunteers can stay in their roles for up to three years.

Reappointment is possible for a second term of up to three years. A maximum of six years can be served in one position.

Elections for all vacant electable positions are to be conducted as part of the group’s Annual Meeting (AM), or as vacancies arise.

Other standard volunteer training, eg General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) training, will be provided by IChemE.
