

National Early Careers Group – Committee Member Volunteer Role Descriptor

1. Introduction

The purpose of IChemE's National Early Careers Groups is to facilitate collaboration, the exchange of ideas and good practice between an inter-connected community of Early Career Engineers (ECE) in collaboration with staff and regional groups to:-

- Inspire future engineers
- Support chemical engineering students
- Provide information, and professional development opportunities to early careers professionals

To encourage and nurture effective communication between:

- IChemE Early Career members and appropriate IChemE groups/forums
- Recent graduates and early careers professionals

Membership of the National Early Careers Group is typically drawn from Student, Affiiliate and Associate members of IChemE in the relevant country. Typically, representatives will be drawn from Local Member Groups (LMG) and the composition should be reviewed to ensure a balanced representation from each National Region or LMG. Each Group reports back to the Member Engagement Committee.

All representatives of the National Early Careers Group will be IChemE members, preferably working towards professional registration. An early career member is defined as a member of IChemE less than 10 years into their professional career.

2. What you will be doing

Committee Members

Volunteers who occupy committee roles typically:

- endeavour to attend all meetings, or send apologies for absence
- provide comments on papers where you are unable to attend
- prepare for the meeting by reading the agenda, papers, and any emails before the meeting
- share ideas and views
- demonstrate skills, knowledge and interests that relate to specific MG or SIG volunteer roles (e.g., STEM liaison, University liaison, PEI engagement, events organiser etc.)
- take ownership and accountability for the fulfilment of assigned tasks participate in the planning and delivery of an annual programme of activities supporting IChemE's strategy

3. About you

Representatives of the National Early Careers Group will be IChemE members, preferably working towards professional registration. An early career member is defined as a member of IChemE less than 10 years into their professional career.

- personal satisfaction that your contribution helps to support a global network of young chemical engineers.
- provides extensive networking opportunities
- enhances your own CPD and their professionalism in a wider context than your own specific job role / professional interests
- enhances your knowledge of chemical engineering and the opportunities it may offer

5. Time commitment

Committee members can expect to spend two to six hours per month on average

6. Period of appointment

Early Career Committee volunteers can stay in their roles for up to two years. Reappointment is possible for a second term of up to two years. A maximum of four years can be served in one position.

(note: Early Career Volunteer roles are typically shorter in nature do the migratory nature of undergraduate / graduate careers)
