1. Introduction

Are you interested in inspiring the next generation? Working with our talented delivery partners, you can bring real-life context to raise young people's awareness of the breadth of the sector and the wonderful opportunities it can offer.

2. What you will be doing

Attend a workshop organised and led by our delivery partners. These events give Year 8 (S1/S2 Scotland) students the chance to explore chemical engineering through a hands-on activity day, building teamwork and employability skills.

You will share information about your role and your career path with the young people bring real-life context and raise awareness of the range of industries in the sector and the wealth of roles available to them. You can also engage with the young people to answer their questions about the industry.

You will be fully briefed ahead of the day and have a point of contact for any questions.

- a chemical engineer, either individually or as part of a team of engineers
- be an IChemE member (any grade) of the Institution
